

#### Thus saith the Lord...

# Luke 22:53 When I was daily with you in the temple,

- you stretched forth no hands against me:
- but this is your hour,
- and the power of darkness.

- **Evil** is having its moment right now.
  - The forces of evil are having their way for a time.
- This is an <a href="mailto:important observation">important observation</a> that Jesus makes.

- Evil has its day and Jesus accepts this truth.
- But Evil will lose!
  - It is evil
     that lurks
     in the darkness.

### •Luke 22:53 "This is your hour, and the power of darkness.

- The <u>serpent</u> himself has now come in Judas as he comes into all our lives.
- He comes in the "darkness of the midnight."

- Midnight Lyrics-Coldplay
  - In the darkness
  - Before the dawn
    - In the swelling
      - Of this storm
  - And hope is gone
    - Leave a light on.

- The world is obsessed with darkness.
  - 1 John 5:19
    "The whole world lieth in wickedness".
    - Or "darkness"

- You have to take a long drive somewhere and you set out well before dawn to make a good start.
  - It is winter,

    and the snow
    is coming down heavily.

 The headlights catch the tumbling flakes a little way ahead of you, but otherwise, all around you, there is nothing to see or be seen.

- The darkness is so complete,
- a darkness
   so dense
   you wonder if...

  You will survive it?
- It is hard to believe that it will ever be day again.

- There is no sky for the sun to rise in
- There is nothing to get your bearings by,
- Nobody anywhere
   to point you on your way
  - Or reassure you by the sound of a human voice.

- As you travel slowly into the night,
- it's as if night travels
   slowly into you.
  - There is a darkness within,
- Darkness piling up in you like snow on a winter's day...

- Daybreak
   is what
   you're hoping for.
  - Lightto see by
  - Light to
     give you hope.
- Hope to see what awaits at the end of the road.

- •Or maybe it is night, and you are home alone.
  - •The doctor has ordered certain tests.
- And you are in the dark as to how it will turn out.

- So you lie there
   in the dark
   straining to hear time's tale
   ahead of time.
- Till <u>past</u> time, <u>present</u> time, <u>future</u> time <u>all start to whisper at once.</u>
  - We haveall been there.

- Morning will come at last, and with it the word that you wait for will be spoken at last,
- Words that bring you <u>hope</u>.
  - Words that gives you your life back.
    - For day has come and with it light.
      - "Joy will come in the morning" (Psalm 30:5)

 Waiting for the words of life to be spoken.

•Because
in the darkness
we are all a little lost.

- There is <u>doubt</u>
   hard on the heels of belief,
  - Fear hard on the heels of every hope,
    - Lives in ruin

because the world has ruined them and we have ruined them.

But still faith waits
 for the light.

## • Faith waits for the opening of a door,

- Faith waits for the sound of footsteps in the hall,
  - Faith waits for a loved one's voice.

- We are like Nathaniel
   sitting under the fig tree
   (John 1:43-51)
  - Most likely contemplating life.
- When suddenly <u>Philip</u> appears out of nowhere.
  - "Come and see,"
- Philip says to Nathaniel, to all of us.

"We have found him,"

- Nathaniel says.
   Found whom?
   Found what?
- "Come and see!"
   says Philip
- "The one of whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote."
  - The one whom
     Jeremiah called
     "The hope of Israel"
     (Jeremiah 17:13)

- The giver of
   <u>light</u> and <u>life</u>,
  "I am the light of the world"
- The beloved one for whom all the world has been awaiting (Romans 8:22)
  - And will always wait
     whether it
     knows it or not.

- It's not justNathanael
- But all of us,
   whoever we are,
- Holding our <u>breath</u>.
  - As all of history has held its breath
  - To hear

     who it is

     that Philip has found.

- Then Philip tells Nathaniel it is "<u>Jesus</u>."
- A <u>name</u> like any other name.
  - "From Nazareth," a place like any other place.
  - Do you laugh? Do you cry?
    - The world does **both**.

- •Then Nathaniel ask, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?"
  - Can anything good come out of darkness?

• Of

"Darkness"

this your hour!

(Luke 22:53)

Says our Jesus.

• In the vernacular Give it your best shot.

#### Can light come out of that which the world scorns?

- Out of that "Darkness"
- Springs comfort.
- Comfort for the many characters in the Bible of whom we know very little.

- Comfort for the woman who would but "touch the hem of His garment."
- Comfort for the woman who anointed Jesus with a jar of perfume.
  - Comfort for a thief
     who hung on a cross
     beside Jesus.

- We are told only that they will be remembered.
- However "insignificant" their lives were to society,
- They have been captured in the pages of history as people worth remembering,
- People remembered by God <u>when the world</u> <u>wished them forgotten.</u>

- It is a kind reminder that our own fleeting lives are remembered by God long before others notice
  - And long after they have stopped noticing.

- We know very little about the man named <u>Simeon</u>,
- But we know
   he was in the temple
   when he realized that
   God had remembered him.
   (Luke 2:25)

- With wrinkled hands he cradled the infant, and sang to God:
  - Luke 2:29

"Now, Lord, you have kept your promise, and you may let your servant go in peace.

- 2:30 With my own eyes I have seen your salvation,
- 2:31 which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples:
- 2:32 A light to reveal your will to the Gentiles and bring glory to your people Israel."

- Luke 2:34-35
   Simeon blessed them
   and said to Mary, his mother,
- "This child is chosen by God for the <u>destruction</u> and the <u>salvation</u> of many in Israel.
- He will be a sign from God which many people will speak against and so reveal their secret thoughts.
  - And sorrow, like a sharp sword,
    - will break your own heart."

 An old man of God tells Mary & Joseph that in this child's life is to be both "light" and "darkness".

- For thousands of years, since Adam's time,
   he is the one for whom we've been waiting.
- The light that the darkness has been trying to extinguish.
  - He is the light that will extinguishes all darkness.
  - No wonder this the "hour,"
    - The opportunity to extinguish that "<u>light</u>".

- Can any one <u>life</u>
   shed "<u>light</u>"
   <u>on the mystery</u>
   <u>of life itself?</u>
  - Because that is what we wait for.

- That is what <u>religion</u> is about
- That is what <u>churches</u> are about,
  - That is what our <u>hymns</u> and <u>preaching</u> and <u>prayers</u>
     are all about,
    - Though there

      <u>are times</u>

      you would hardly know it.

## • Life:

- That's what we all hunger for,
  - Wait for,
- Keep coming back to church to find it
  - Or avoiding it
    like the plague
    as the last places on earth
    to find it.

- It's life as we've never really known
- •Life that we have only dreamed about.
- Life with each other.
  - Life for each other.

- •Life with all the darkness gone.
- And Phillip tells Nathaniel
   he has found it.
  - Can it be true?
  - "Come and see!"

- Do we really know who Jesus is,
  - •Is He our Jesus?
- Have we found Him?
  - •The thing is,

    He was never lost.

- He is not ours.
   If anything,
   we are his.
- Who is this Jesus?
  - "Come and see!"

- He is the Mystery child of the ages.
- Philip tells Nathaniel, "Come and see".
  - And there is no other way for any of us.
- So, what do you see?

- It was just a little way for **Nathaniel** to travel.
- Just around the <u>bend</u>
   And up the <u>hill</u>.
- But in a sense
   Nathaniel

   had been traveling there
   his whole life.

## • In a sense you and I have too:

- To <u>see</u> at last and to be seen,
- To know and to be known,
  - To find and to be found.

 If we could somehow meet one of the great ones of history, which one would we choose?

Name your <u>hero</u>.

 If you and I were to meet them they would have nothing to give us but their greatness,

 Nothing to ask of us but our admiration.

In the saints and heroes of the past we would find them cut from the same cloth as we are after all.

- Someone often lost,
  - full of <u>doubt</u>,
  - yet full of <u>hope</u>.
  - Waiting for the "<u>Darkness</u>" to lift.
  - Waiting as you and I do for the "Light" to deliver us.

- Philip is right,
   it is not just somebody
   greater than we
   whom we wish to meet,
  - It is not someone
     <u>out of the past</u>
     that comes to meet us.
- For there are many great "heroes of faith"

  whom we wish to meet.

- It is that special someone who has come out of the "Darkness".
  - Who can deliver us.
  - That is the special someone we all long to meet.

- He is the one whom
   Moses and the prophets foretold,
   Philip says.
  - He is the
     Word made flesh.
  - He is the
     word of all words
     that speaks out to
     life's deepest mystery.

- Around the <u>bend</u>
   and up the <u>hill</u> a piece.
  - We find the light that shines out of "Darkness".
- The one for whom we <u>await</u> is the one for whom we have <u>prayed</u>.
  - We are Nathaniel.
    - Come and see,
       Philip tells us.

So we come
 as Nathaniel came,
 to see for ourselves
 if it is true what Philip says,

 And what for all our lives
 we sometimes believed and sometimes failed to believe.

- Many of our best dreams have turned out to be only dreams.
  - The world has taught us to be prepared always for the worst.
- But we come nevertheless
   come in faith.

- The "Darkness" has not yet won.
- Jesus states
   that evil
   is having its moment
   right now.
  - Evil has its day and Jesus accepts this truth.
  - The question is,
     "Will evil win"?

- What Nathaniel saw
   when he looked
   into that face
   we do not know.
  - What mattered was <u>what Jesus saw.</u>

- He saw <u>Nathaniel</u> with all his secrets laid bare.
  - We will know him
     when we see him,
     and, more crucial still,
     he will know us.
- "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile."
  - He that sat in "Darkness" has seen a great light.

- "Rabbi, you are the Son of God!
  You are the King of Israel!"
  - I picture you and me standing there too, not guileless by a long shot, but full of all that the world has filled us with...

- Disillusion and doubt,
  - Love and fear,
  - Deceit and hope,
  - And everything else that makes us,us.
    - Everything that "Darkness"
       throws at us.

- We who spend most of our lives <u>believing that we wait only</u> <u>for morning to break,</u>
  - Waiting for some light to shine out of the world's "Darkness".
  - While we wait and listen
     we hear a voice
     off in the distance saying,
    "I am the light of the world!"

- "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light;
- Those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness,
  - On them has the light shined."

- Deep is the darkness of our time.
- And most of what light comes our way is <u>random</u> and <u>elusive</u>.
  - Not only elusive but deceptive.


- But we like
