


Thus saith the Lord...

- We begin today's lesson with some pictures of a city known as <u>Edom</u> or <u>Petra</u>.
- This will give you some appreciation why the Edomites were proud and arrogant.
 - Proverbs 16:18

 Pride goes before destruction,
 and an haughty spirit
 before a fall.

The following are pictures relating to our lesson in Obadiah.


Hidden away until August 22, 1812













 Anyone who feels frustrated that injustice sometimes goes unpunished should know about Obadiah.

 Obadiah teaches us about God's long-term plan to bring closure to issues that military and judicial action struggles to accomplish.

- It's a comforting book to read after hearing an unsettling news report of terrorism, racial injustice, genocide,etc.
 - Anytime the innocent are targeted and we're left waiting for justice to be done, the book of Obadiah reassures us that God never relegates unresolved injustices to a shelf of cold cases.
 - He never forgets.

- To understand who the Edomites were and why God wanted them gone, one needs to know the story of <u>Jacob</u> and <u>Esau</u>.
- Their ongoing combative relationship.
- The antagonism their descendants
 felt toward one another
 for generations.
 - It is an ancient version of the famous feud between the Hatfields & McCoys.

- The message of Obadiah is that the Edomites would be exterminated.
- Because of their unrepentant, remorseless
 terrorism against Israel.
- The conspicuous absence
 of all things Edomite
 is potent proof
 that God's prophecy
 has been fulfilled literally.

It isn't difficult to connect the dots for our people from that historical reality to warnings about the world today.

- As sure as the Word of God was about the judgment on Edom,
- Certain is the doom that awaits all who reject the **forgiveness** and **mercy** to be found only in Jesus Christ.

 The same Bible that predicted the devastation of Edom, who rejected God's offer of forgiveness, is the same Bible that promises the destruction of those who reject Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

• Luke 13:3
Except you repent,
you shall all likewise perish

- The **Edomites** were descendants of Esau. the rejected twin of the chosen Jacob.
- The only way to have access to forgiveness is through the covenant God made to Abraham which the Edomites failed to do..
 - Romans 3:23
 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;
 - The only refuge from God's wrath is to be protected under His covenant.
 - Acts 2:47
 And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved.

- Why preach Obadiah?
- Because people need to bask in the comfort that God will bring justice to those who target the innocent.

- Abortion, genocide, racial injustice, acts of terrorism, and violence make us cry out for justice.
 - But God will bring closure in his time.
 - for the iniquity of the Amorites is not yet full.

 (Genesis 15:16)
 - And that is a message from the book of Obadiah

The book of Obadiah
 is not well known
 but it contains some
 powerful lessons for our day.

• It is the only one-chapter book in the Old Testament and contains only 21 verses.

 The occasion of the book is some recent attack on Jerusalem by the Philistines in which **Edom** had aided and abetted.

- Edom had:
- Encouraged Judah's foes,
 - Enjoyed Judah's fall,
- Enslaved Judah's fugitives.
- The book warns Edom of her own coming destruction for her sins against her brother.

• OBADIAH'S MESSAGE

- •The fall of Edom is because of Edom's sin.
 - Her sin of pride and and cruelty.

- Her crimes are described in progressive stages:
- # 1 Edom stood by while Jerusalem was invaded v.11
- # 2 She rejoiced over the captivity of sons of Judah v.12.
 - #3 She actively participated in looting Jerusalem v.13;
 - # 4 Edom prevented their brethren from escaping
- # 5 And sold them into slavery V. 14 ₂₆

•THE HISTORY OF EDOM.

- •1. The people of Edom descended from Esau, Jacob's twin brother.
- •2. There was sibling rivalry between Edom and Israel, found first in Esau and Jacob.

- The twins struggled in their mother's womb. (Genesis 25:22-26).
- Esau sold his birthright to Jacob. (Genesis 25:27-34).
- Jacob stole Esau's blessing as the firstborn. (Genesis 27)

- While Jacob and Esau eventually reconciled. (Genesis 32-33).
 - Their descendants were often at odds with one another.

- In the Exodus,
 Edom refused Israel passage
 through their land.
 (Numbers 20:14-21)
 - Edom was finally conquered by David.
 (2 Samuel 8:13-14).
 - During the reign of Jehoram, Edom revolted. (2 Kings 8:20-22).

- Located south of the Dead Sea, they built their cities in the cliffs and thought themselves secure from attack.
- The Edomites were a rough and tough group of mountain people.

- They carved great <u>protective fortresses</u> in the rock mountains.
- One of their principle cities was Sela (Hebrew),
 or
 Petra (Greek),
 which simply meant
 "The Rock".
- After the prophecy of Obadiah...

- The Edomites were overcome <u>by the Nabataeans</u> (Arabs), forced to settle south of Judah.
 - Around 100 B.C.,
 they were conquered
 by the Maccabees.
 - The Maccabees forced many of them to be circumcised and accept the Law.
 - Herod the Great was a Moabite.
 - By 100 A.D.,
 Edom as a race and nation
 had become lost to history.

- A COMING JUDGMENT IS PREDICTED

 TO FALL ON EDOM

 (Obadiah 1:1-9).
 - "The vision of Obadiah: 'Thus says the Lord GOD concerning Edom.
- We have heard a report from the LORD,
 And an envoy has been sent among
 the nations saying,
 'Arise and let us go against her for battle...."
 (v.1).
 - What does this say to us about world affairs and wars?

- <u>Deceived by pride in her location</u>, Edom will be brought down.
 - "Behold, I will make you small among the nations;
- You are greatly despised.
 The arrogance of your heart has deceived you,
 - You who live in the clefts of the rock,
 In the loftiness of your dwelling place,
 - Who say in your heart,
 'Who will bring me down to earth?'
 Though you build high like the eagle,
 - Though you set your nest among the stars,
 - From there I will bring you down,' declares the LORD" (vs.2-4).

- Their Destruction will be complete.
 - "If thieves came to you,
 If robbers by night
 O how you will be ruined!
 - Would they not steal only until they had enough?
 - If grape gatherers came to you, Would they not leave some gleanings?
- O how Esau will be ransacked, And his hidden treasures searched out!"

- Edom will be betrayed by her allies.
 - Obadiah 1:7
 All your allies will force you from your homeland!
 - Your treaty partners will deceive you and overpower you.
 - Your trusted friends will set an ambush for you that will take you by surprise!

- Not even wisdom and might can save them because God is against them.
- Obadiah 1:8-9
 At that time," the LORD says,
 "I will destroy the
 wise sages of Edom,
 the advisers from Esau's mountain!
- Your warriors will be shattered,...
 so that everyone will be destroyed from Esau's mountain!

- THE REASON FOR JUDGMENT ON EDOM (vs.10-16).
 - Notice carefully that Edom is being judged for her violence toward Jacob.
- Because of violence to your brother Jacob, You will be covered with shame, And you will be cut off forever.
 - On the day that you stood aloof,
 - On the day that strangers carried off his wealth,
 And foreigners entered his gate
 - And cast lots for Jerusalem,
 You too were as one of them" (vs.10-11).

- A rebuke against their conduct,
- Obadiah 1:12-14
- 12 You should not have gloated when your relatives suffered calamity.
 - You should not have rejoiced over the people of Judah when they were destroyed.
 - You should not have boasted when they suffered adversity.40

- A rebuke against their conduct,
- Obadiah 1:12-14
- 1:13 You should not have entered the city of my people when they experienced distress.
- You should not have joined in gloating over their misfortune when they suffered distress.
- You should not have looted their wealth when they endured distress.

- A rebuke against their conduct,
- Obadiah 1:12-14
- 1:14 You should not have stood at the fork in the road to slaughter those trying to escape.
- You should not have captured their refugees when they suffered adversity.

- Therefore the
 "Day of the Lord"
 for them will mean receiving
 the same sort of treatment!
- "For the day of the LORD draws near on all the nations.

 As you have done, it will be done to you.
- Your dealings will return on your own head.
 Because just as you drank on My holy mountain,
 All the nations will drink continually.
 They will drink and swallow
 And become as if they had never existed" (vs.15-16).

- Deliverance and holiness will be found on Mt. Zion, not Mt. Seir
- Mt. Seir being
 the prominent mountain in Edom.
 - "But on Mount Zion there will be those who escape. And it will be holy." (Obadiah 1:17).
- There is not the slightest hint
 whatever in this passage
 of any return of literal Jews
 to Palestine.

- The Tabernacle sat on Mt. Zion.
- •So God sat enthroned in this Most Holy Place.
 - It was God and not the people who made Mt. Zion superior to Mt Seir.

- The saved assembled upon that mountain.
 - The "saved" today find their salvation on Mt. Zion.
 (Revelation 14:1)
- •God still sits on His throne in the new Jerusalem on Mt. Zion (Hebrews. 12:22-24).

- Hebrews 12:22-24 (ASV)
- 22 but you are come unto mount Zion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable hosts of angels,
 - 23 to the general assembly and church of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,
 - 24 and to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant,...

- The house of Jacob shall consume the house of Esau,
- "And the house of Jacob will possess their possessions.
- Then the house of Jacob will be a fire And the house of Joseph a flame;
 - But the house of Esau will be as stubble.
 - And they will set them on fire and consume them,
 So that there will be no survivor of the house of Esau,'
- For the LORD has spoken" (vs.17-18).

- Judah's people
 were not any better
 than Edom's.
- It was the fact that
 Jehovah sat on Zion,
 not Seir.
 - Therefore,
 there is strength
 in the Lord.
- Isaiah 59:1
 Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither his ear heavy, that it cannot hear:

- THE FULFILLED PROPHECY.
- ITS IMMEDIATE FULFILLMENT.
 - Edom's destruction began with the Babylonian invasion under Nebuchadnezzar (600 B.C.).
- It continued into the fourth century B.C.
 with the invasion of the Arabs
 known as the Nabataeans,
 forcing them to a region south of Judah.
- •In the second century B.C.,
 the Maccabees brought them under

 Jewish subjection
 when Judas Maccabeus
 slew twenty thousand of them.
 - •And forced the remnant to accept circumcision and the Law.

- The prophets were not intending that all they predicted of Mount Zion would be fulfilled literally.
- Their predictions of the glorious things that were to happen there were intended to be
 fulfilled in the Messiah and His kingdom.
- This is plainly apparent when one compares the scriptures listed below..

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(Isa_33:17-24; Eze_34:11-31; Isa_28:16; 1Pe_2:6; Zec_9:9; Mat_21:5; Isa_59:20-21; Rom_11:25; and especially, Gal_4:25 ff; Heb_12:22-24).
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• That the members of the New Testament church were to be the recipients of the prophetic blessings is shown quite conclusively by the following scriptures:

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(Act_3:11-26; Act_13:29-37;
Act_15:13-18; Rom_3:21-22;
Rom_9:2-8; Rom_15:8; Rom_15:12;
Rom_15:20-21; Rom_15:27;
Rom_16:25-27; Heb_12:18-29). 52
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- ITS ULTIMATE FULFILLMENT...
- Began with the coming of Jesus Christ.
- For with His coming the establishment of
 His the spiritual kingdom
 <u>deliverance</u> and <u>holiness</u>
 are found on
 <u>Mt. Zion</u>
 that is Jerusalem.
- That repentance and remission of sins should be preached in his name unto all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. (Luke 24:47)
 - # 227 On Zion's Glorious Summit

- CONCLUSION:
- The prophets were not limited in their prophecies to just the nation of Israel.
 - God held the
 <u>heathen nations</u>

 accountable for their actions.
 - While it was written primarily
 <u>to comfort the Israelites</u>
 in Obadiah's day,
 there are lessons
 to be gleaned
 <u>for us as well...</u>


The message of hope
 has its ultimate fulfillment
 in what we can enjoy
 ourselves today,
 in the person and work of Jesus!

- <u>In verse 15</u>, we find the expression "<u>the day of the Lord</u>".
- An expression often used by the prophets referring to God's judgment upon the nations.

- The particular
 "day of the Lord"
 of which Obadiah wrote
 was "near",
 and was fulfilled with
 the destruction of Edom.
 - But there is another
 "day of the Lord"
 yet to come.
- Of which God's judgments upon the nations were only a shadow of that which is to come.

Think on these things Philippians 4:8
